15 nurses. I know that anyone can go to school and become doctors or nurses. When
16 walking around the hospital and just waiting for my sister to get done with her surgery, I
17 saw that things have barely changed.

18 My sister's nurses were all female. And her surgeon was a male. Just being in
19 the hospital I saw mainly female nurses! There were few male nurses. That's where I
20 say things have changed a little bit. Back in the day, male were not known as nurses.
